Multi-ticket book

1,000 yen

This is a book of 11 tickets for Edo Bus without expiration.

One-day pass

300 yen

This ticket is used for one-day only (taking Edo Bus as many times as you like for the day you bought the ticket)

One-month commuters pass

3,000 yen

The pass is valid for one month and in bearer form. It can be used by the single pass holder.

One-year commuter pass

30,000 yen

The pass is valid for one year, which is a specially designed plastic card and used solely by the card holder. Purchasing this pass means supporting the Edo Bus system as an individual sponsor.

### A Nihonbashi Bridge 1-1 Nihonbashi ..... Get off at Bus Stop ⑧

This symbol of the Edo period was constructed by order of Tokugawa Ieyasu in 1603 and was affectionately referred to as Oedo Nihonbashi. The Renaissance stone bridge, currently used, was constructed in 1911 after tearing down the wooden old one. This bridge was firstly designated a nationally important cultural property as the road bridge now in use in 1999. The description on the copper plate on the center of the bridge means a point of departure for the national route.

### B Mitsui Memorial Museum, Mitsui Main Building ..... Get off at Bus Stop ⑩

The museum with its new style features attractive architecture and excellent exhibits. It was designated as a nationally important cultural property in 1998. The Corinthian columns and interior of the operating room on the first floor are stunning works of architecture. The museum is representative of buildings in the early days of the Showa period and is regarded as the oldest American-style building that still exists in Japan.

### C Bank of Japan ..... Get off at Bus Stop ⑨

2-1-1 Nihonbashi Hongokucho

Founded in 1882, this is the central bank of Japan. Known for its antique and monumental structure, the building is regarded as valuable, authentic Western architecture from the Meiji period and is designated as an important cultural property.

### D Currency Museum ..... Get off at Bus Stop ⑧

You can learn everything about money, from ancient Japanese currencies to the origination of today's yen as well as exotic currencies around the world at the museum.

### E Ozu History Museum and Ozu Gallery ..... Get off at Bus Stop ⑪

The gallery exhibits historic materials that have been kept since the wholesale paper store was moved from Ise Matsusaka to Edo.

### A Suitengu Shrine ..... Get off at Bus Stop ⑫

2-4-1 Nihonbashi Kakigaracho Tel:03-3666-7195

Suitengu enshrines the gods known for blessings of easy birth, avoidance of water accidents, and the liquor trade. Stalls operate in the shrine every fifth day of the month. It is particularly busy on January 5. With a relaxed and warm atmosphere, the shrine is full of the friendly spirit typical to areas known as shitamachi.

### B Amazake Yokochi (Sweet-fermented-Rice-Drink Alley) ..... Get off at Bus Stop ⑬⑭⑮

Ningyocho barely escaped the damage during the war. It retains the sight of a traditional downtown (shitamachi) area. Numerous well-established stores and restaurants are concentrated in Amazake Yokochi. This is a perfect course for walking and enjoying the shitamachi spirit.

### C Setomono-ichi (China Market) ..... Get off at Bus Stop ⑮

The market takes place on Ningyocho-dori Street for three consecutive weekdays in early August to sell the inventories of pottery wholesalers. Do not miss this opportunity to find great bargains.

### D Hana-matsuri (Flower Festival) (Ningyocho Okannonji Temple) ..... Get off at Bus Stop ⑮⑯

Celebrating Buddha's birthday, the temple serves amacha (hydrangea tea) and sweets to worshippers. It also features an instant lottery. (Early April)

### E Hamacho Park ..... Get off at Bus Stop ⑰

2-59-1 Nihonbashi Hamacho

In the past, the current location of Hamacho Park was a garden of the Hosokawa Domain from Kumamoto. In 1929, the municipal park opened in the same location. It commands a view of the Sumida River. Additionally, an indoor athletic facility and athletic field are located on the same premises, allowing visitors to enjoy exercise.

### F Toshino-ichi (Year-End Market) (Yagenbori Fudojin) ..... Get off at Bus Stop ⑰

The market sells New Year goods. Clothing is also available at low prices. The market is open from December 27 to 29.

## Casual town with full of vitality

### Tsukiji Shintomi Hacchobori Akashicho Irifune Minato Shinkawa

### A Tsukiji Hongwanji Temple ..... Get off at Bus Stop ③

3-15-1 Tsukiji Tel:03-3541-1131

This is a branch temple of the Kyoto-based Hongwanji sect (Nishi Hongwanji) of Jodo Shinshu. The design of the exotic stone building is based on ancient Indian style. Historic monuments such as KUUYO Takeko's poem monument, AZUMA, Shinroku (known as one of the famous royal samurai called Ako-gishi) memorial tower and Matsuo Basho's haiku monument are located on the temple premises.

### B Chuo Historical Museum / Planetarium "Time Dome Akashi" ..... Get off at Bus Stop ④⑮

Complex with Chuo City Public Health Center and other facilities, 12-1 Akashicho

You will find the historic and folklore cultural aspect of Chuo-ku in this dome.

### C Kyobashi Library (Area Resource Center) ..... Get off at Bus Stop ①①

This library is in possession of valuable and historic resources of Edo and Tokyo, which reflect the flow of time of Chuo City and surrounded areas. The number of resources count about 20,000.

### D Tsukiji Outer Market ..... Get off at Bus Stop ③⑮

Grocery stores and many other stores line the market, where you can feel the freshness of the products. The market is open to the public. It is recommended that you visit and walk around the market from the early morning to about noon.

### E Namiyoke Inari Shrine ..... Get off at Bus Stop ⑮

Located next to kaikobashi Bridge of Tsukiji Outer Market, the shrine is regarded as very important and is associated with the god of prosperity in fish-related businesses and safe voyages. The shrine holds a big festival every three years and its annual festival is four days long on the weekend near June 10. It features a large lion-figured portable shrine, the best of its kind in Japan.

### F Tsukiji Fish Information Center and Museum ..... Get off at Bus Stop ③

The museum of fish is located in the Tokyo Metropolitan Central Wholesale Market.

### G Teppozu Inari Shrine ..... Get off at Bus Stop ⑧

From the Edo period, the local guardian god has flourished as the gateway to the sea. The shrine's annual festival has an ancient and honorable origin and is the first shrine festival in Tokyo to be held in May, bustling with many visitors from inside and outside of Tokyo.

### H Kachidoki Bridge Museum ..... Get off at Bus Stop ⑮

## New popular spots attracting attention that is filled with the shitamachi spirit

### Tsukuda Tsukishima Harumi Kachidoki Toyomicho

### A Tsukudajima: Birthplace of Tsukudani ( food boiled in soy sauce) ..... Get off at Bus Stop ⑪

1-2 and 3 Tsukuda

Tsukudani was originated in the Edo period. When the fishermen who had moved from Tsukudamura in Settsu Province (currently Osaka) started the practice of eating preserved seafood, Three tsukudani stores continue to operate, having inherited their tradition from the Edo period.

### B Sumiyoshi Jinja Shrine ..... Get off at Bus Stop ⑪

This is a guardian god of the area that includes Tsukudajima and Tsukishima. The deity of Sumiyoshi Shrine of Osaka was partly moved to this place. The shrine has an annual festival and a large triennial festival where nearly 100 octagonal portable shrines march in tsukudabayashi, one of the three major pieces of traditional festival music in Edo. The gotan flag (very long labarum) and male/female lion heads jostle their way in the whole area.

### C Ishikawajima Museum ..... Get off at Bus Stop ⑩

The museum showcases the history of Ishikawajima as the birthplace of Japan's modern shipbuilding industry.

### D River City 21 ..... Get off at Bus Stop ⑩

River City 21 is a futuristic area with a high-quality, comfortable living environment, naturally anticipated in the 21st century, with spaces for nurturing personal interactions. It exists in a superb contrast with the townscape full of the shitamachi spirit.

### E Paris Circus ..... Get off at Bus Stop ⑩

The Circus was designed to commemorate Paris and Tokyo being sister cities.

### F Nishinaka-dori Shopping Street ..... Get off at Bus Stop ⑫

also known as Tsukishima Monja Street

Filled with the shitamachi spirit, the shopping street is very close to the lives of common people. Plants and flowers abound in front of the houses located along the back streets, changing color by season. Most of all, Tsukishima is famous for monjayaki, a type of Japanese pancake. <Tsukishima Monja Shinkoukai, Tel: 03-3532-1990>

### G Kachidoki Bridge ..... Get off at Bus Stop ⑮⑯

Construction of the electric movable bridge was completed in 1940. The bridge has a stout appearance and could be raised and opened at its center. In August 1964, Tsukuda Ohashi Bridge was completed upstream. Kachidoki Bridge has not been opened since November 1970, because of the reduced amount of ships passing through and an increase in vehicular traffic. In June 2007, Kachidoki Bridge was designated as a nationally important cultural property.

### H Harumi Island Triton Square ..... Get off at Bus Stop ⑮⑰
